The City of Papillion recently received results from our 2021 National Community Survey, independently conducted by the National Research Center. We participate in this survey periodically to gauge residents' opinions on various aspects of living in Papillion. The survey, which randomly selected 2,700 residents to participate, helps us as a city government understand where we are excelling and where we have room for improvement. Feedback from the survey helps our elected officials and staff make decisions regarding future budget prioritization and planning. I have included a flier with a summary of the survey findings. The high response rate is one indicator of an engaged community.
